June: Microchip your pet. For only \$5 and all kittens are two for the price of one. Purchase a \$5 microchip receive a one-year dog license. June 1-June 30th all room and board fees waived for return to owners. All kitten adoptions two for the price of one.

July: National Lost Pet Prevention Month. A pet gets lost every two seconds in the United States, and only one in every ten cases of lost pets is reunited with their family. This has led to a nationwide effort to better educate the public on licensing, leashing, and chipping efforts. Additionally, the 4th of July and the weeks preceding and after, add the issue of loud bursting fireworks. This has traditionally led to increased pets running away and getting lost during that time. SASA will promote Lost Pet Prevention by providing a month-long amnesty period suspending fines for unlicensed dogs to encourage people to license their dogs. Additionally, SASA would like to offer free microchips with the purchase of a dog license during July.

August: National Clear the Shelter Day has been a staple for years, traditionally recognized as the third Saturday of August. This Fiscal Year, Clear the Shelter Day will be Friday & Saturday, August 25th & 26th. SASA will offer free dog and cat adoptions on those days.

The City of Hughson and Gilton Solid Waste Management, Inc. will be providing a Waste Disposal Voucher Program this year from **May 1 through July 31, 2022**, as an alternative to the annual "Clean Up Day" event, which is usually held the first weekend in May of each year. The voucher will be good for a one-time free dumping fee at Gilton Resource Recovery / Transfer Facility, Inc. located at 800 S. McClure Road, Modesto, CA. This voucher is being sent to all residential garbage customers residing within the City of Hughson who have garbage service. **Please read the voucher carefully as it contains information on the dates it is valid and what is required at the time of use.**

DON'T USE ILLEGAL FIREWORKS

-How does a legal firework become illegal?

Any Safe and Sane firework that is altered or changed in any way can be considered illegal. **Purchased fireworks from stands in the City of Hughson** support organizations within the community. These types of fireworks are legal and can be used in your City of Hughson neighborhood.

-How can you tell if a firework is illegal?

Look for identifiers. Illegal fireworks include those described as cherry bombs, bottle rockets, mortars, aerial shells, M-08's and firecrackers. Illegal fireworks can also easily be identified by **lack of seal approval** from the California State Fire Marshal. If a firework can leave the ground or explode in the air, it is **illegal**.

Possession of any illegal firework is a misdemeanor, and punishable by a fine.

(As per HMC Chapter 8.18-Fireworks, the "responsible party" means any person with ownership interest or right of possession of the real property where the illegal fireworks are possessed. A responsible property need not be present at the time of possession in order to be issued a citation.)
